## BBQ INSTRUCTIONS

1. Open the grill cover.
2. Turn on the timer which is the black knob located on the back post. You will see a 1,2 , or 3 , those are the hours. So, if you turn it to one the gas will stay on for 1 hour and then turn itself off.
3. There are (2) burners - light them one at a time by turning the knob to light and pressing the Ignitor button or the right. You will hear a "whoosh" sound when it lights.
4. Once you have finished grilling turn the two knobs to the off position. You do not need to turn off the timer - it will go off on its own.
5. Clean the grill and close the cover.

Beverly Wombold is no shrinking violet. She has a passion for growing violets and has been very successful at doing so. She and her husband Leroy moved to Las Palmas from Payson as full-residents in 2022. They first purchased a home here in 2018. They moved to Payson from Missouri where Leroy worked as a General Surgeon and Beverly as a Nurse Practitioner in Family Medicine.
Her Grandfather has grown African Violets and one winter when she was bored, she recalled his violets and started doing some research. This was in 2013. She googled African Violets and was amazed at the diversity and number of violets. There are over 12,000 varieties. She ordered her first violet plants and had them delivered in the mail. This began her journey with African Violets. African Violet clubs were much bigger in the 60 's and have been dwindling since. There are two clubs in the Phoenix area and she belongs to one that meets monthly. There are 13-14 people in that club.

from city to city. It is international in scope as well. She has to start preparing for a show a year in advance. The plants are not allowed to bloom 6 months from the start of the show. Removing the blooms helps the leaves to get bigger. As the show draws near the bloom stalks are allowed to bloom. Violets have specific needs to grow well. They like light but not direct light. She uses RO water for the plants that she buys specifically for the plants. They like a light soil that is porous to allow the water to move through. She uses Perlite soil for her plants. This soil used to be mined in Arizona. It

is a volcanic rock that is porous. They require $40-60 \%$ humidity and she wicks water to each individual plant. One room in their house is dedicated to the plants. She makes weekly trips to Payson where they still have a place and that is where she keeps the majority of her violets. Apart from her violets, Beverly like to hike and enjoys places where she can do some bird watching. She is also an active pickleball player here at Las Palmas.
